Floral Marquees

QUARRY FLORAL MARQUEE

This year the marquee will be again be split into two areas, both of which will feature displays by Professional Growers and Nurserymen, with the opportunity to purchase or order plants.

The marquee will contain a wide range of varied displays by exhibitors old and new. We welcome a first time exhibitor, Lana Jeeves, who started her business, Floralana, located in mid-Wales in 2022, specialising in growing flowers in their natural seasons, without the use of pesticides, and also 'Salop Leisure - 'Love Plants', who are staging a large display - an example of a local firm supporting their local Show.

OUTSIDE GARDENS

The Outside Garden exhibits are staged outside Quarry Marquee, adjacent to the War Memorial and feature the following displays:-

Gardencare CM Building Services - 'Courtyard Garden' - A garden incorporating soft and hard elements that complement each other, with the soft-planting to hard ratio being balanced by the soft colour of the stone.

Pippa Willcox & Emma Mayho - 'The Hobbit House'.

The RJAH Charity - 'Garden for Alice' - Garden for Alice is a fundraising appeal which aims to create a stunning outdoor garden for patients and their families at the Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital. The garden takes its name from the Alice Ward, which is the dedicated children's unit at the Oswestry based hospital.

CG Landscape & Maintenance - 'Downtime' - The concept behind the garden is to create a calm and relaxing dreamscape for a young couple who both work in very busy corporate jobs, where they can enjoy growing produce and then cooking and dining outside using a pizza oven and their own home grown produce.



Severn Marquee

Severn Marquee, houses the amateur competitive classes for Flowers, Fruit and Vegetables, plus the children's competitive classes, and the ever popular Scarecrow Competition. This year there are also classes for Bees & Honey exhibitors.

The marquee will also include:

- Information displays by the Begonia Society who are this year celebrating the 75th anniversary of their formation, and also the Shropshire Master Composters and the Delphinium Society, who we welcome to the marguee this year.
- · Children's displays of their Gardening Projects.
- A series of demonstrations and talks on 'How to Grow and Show' will be presented in the marquee at 11.00am, 12noon, 1.00pm, 2.00pm and 3.00pm on each day.
- Meet & Greet opportunities with Celebrity Gardener David Domoney.

Dingle (Floral Art) Marquee

The Dingle Marquee houses the competitive classes for Floral Art, featuring flower arranging by amateurs, professionals, Flower Clubs and also children. This year's overall floral theme is 'Stage and Screen'.

The marquee will also feature a number of Floral Art demonstrations, commencing on both days at 10.00am. These will take place in the 'How to' area along with the 'How to' table, and run throughout both days, using different techniques for beginners, including arrangements without floral foam. The demonstrators are all NAFAS volunteers, who all have one thing in common – a love of flowers.

As new additions to Floral Art in Dingle Marquee this year, are mannequins 'ON THE RED CARPET' and with the Flower Clubs they bring drama with 'A NIGHT AT THE OPERA'.

Not to be missed is a demonstration of Ikebana, the art of Japanese flower arranging, which will be presented by Noella Plasman-Jones and commencing at 1.00pm - 2.00pm each day.

Flower Show Theatre

There are some changes to the lectures this year with the former Lecture Marquee and Foodhall Lecture areas having been combined to make the Flower Show Theatre, which will also include the former Foodhall, where visitors can enjoy food from a wide range of vendors selling a varied range of food items and equipment.

The theatre has a full programme each day, featuring gardening and celebrity favourites, who will be giving informative talks and demonstrations.

Our celebrity guests include **David Domoney** – gardening expert, author and TV personality; **Clodagh McKenna** – an Irish Chef, author and television presenter who, in addition to writing numerous cookery books, also makes regular appearances on ITV's 'This Morning'; **Andy Clarke** – a food and drink writer, broadcaster, event host and TV producer and Director; **Jane Pugh** – demonstrator and speaker for the Mercia and North Wales Area of NAFAS; **Mike Hinton** – District Parks Manager for Birmingham City Council; and **Mark Wasilewski LVO** – horticulturist and Manager of the Royal Parks.



Children's Entertainment

To keep our younger visitors entertained at this year's show there will be fairground rides and walk-about artistes.

The children's funfair rides will be the 'Cup and Saucer', the Mini-Carousel' and the 'Bungee Trampoline'. The rides will cost £2.50 per time and will be located in an area on the left of the showground as you face the river.

Other entertainment will include a Circus Skills area where the children will be able to learn such skills as juggling, hula-hooping, spinning plates stilt -walking and many others. There will also be interactive Giant Bubbles Shows, presented by 'Bubbles', which are always full of fun and laughter as bubbles are produced in ever increasing sizes.

Walk-about entertainers include a Penny Farthing Biplane – presented by Roger Blighty, who has given his penny farthing bicycle a "bi-plane" upgrade; Giant Sloths, whose mission is to move round the world as slowly as possible on their tricycle, meandering round the showground and taking 'slothies' with bewildered passers-by. Others to look out for include the Green Lady on Stilts and a Facepainter and Storyteller.

Visitor Information

The Shropshire Horticultural Society is committed to making your visit to our Show as pleasant as possible. We aim to meet your needs and expectations wherever we can, and to ensure that your experience of the Show is both enjoyable and comfortable. Please note however that this is an outdoor Show, with temporary facilities, meaning ground conditions may not always be ideal. In addition, the Showground generally slopes down to the river.

Left Luggage - Left luggage facilities are available next to the Plant Creche adjacent to Quarry Marquee. The facility will be open from 8.30am and all items deposited must be collected by 7.30pm.

Access to Exhibits, Gardens and Catering Outlets – All marquees are accessible. All floral exhibits can be viewed from ground level. All catering outlets – including the Members Marquee which has a small ramp – are also accessible.

Disabled Viewing for the Main Arena – A Disabled Viewing Area is available for the Main Arena. However, space is limited and it is not possible to guarantee access to this area at times of high demand. We therefore ask for your co-operation when using this facility, and that at busy times, use is restricted to the disabled visitor and their immediate carer only.

Lost Children - For lost children please contact Show Control, which is located at the top of the Showground by the Members' Marquee. In the event that Show Control receive notification that a child is missing, all gates and access points to the Showground are immediately sealed and no-one is permitted to enter or leave until the child is found.

Toilets - Toilets are located and signed at various points on the Showground, and include WC facilities for disabled users. These facilities are for use by both ladies and gentlemen.

Smoking - Smoking, including electronic cigarettes, is not permitted in any marquee, tent or any enclosed space within the Showground.
