REGULATIONS

The decision of the Society in the interpretation of these regulations is final and binding upon the Exhibitor

Entries must be on the official form and comply with instructions thereon. Entry forms together with entry fee(s) to be forwarded to The Secretary, Shropshire Horticultural Society, Quarry Lodge, Shrewsbury, SY1 1RN.

ENTRY FEES (including VAT)

For 3 Entries or less	£10.00
For each additional entry	£1.50
Children's	£1.00

Members of the Society's General Committee may **not** exhibit in the competitive classes.

All exhibitors must comply with the regulations of the Society. Non-observance of them may result in withholding of awards.

Cancellation of Entries

• Exhibitors unable to stage their exhibit are to advise the Secretary as soon as possible, and no later than seven days before the Show. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event of failure to exhibit.

The Society cannot undertake to receive or return any exhibit.

Entries are accepted at the discretion of the Committee. If an exhibit is considered to be of an inappropriate or unacceptable standard, then entry may be refused by the Committee. **The Society reserves the right to decline any exhibit.**

Exhibitors' Badges/Collection Tickets/Vehicle Collection Permits

- Exhibitors' badges will be issued to Severn Marquee Exhibitors who have <u>staged</u> three or more classes.
- If less than three are staged a ticket to allow entry for collection of exhibits after 6pm on Saturday will be provided. **THIS IS NON-NEGOTIABLE**.
- Check in at a Collection Point within the Severn Marquee.
- After exhibits have been staged a Steward will issue the relevant badge/ticket/collection permit.
- Badges must be signed and worn at all times, collection tickets must be signed on the back and be available for inspection if requested.
- All Junior Exhibitors will be issued with an Exhibitors Badge.

Severn Marquee Opening and Closing Times:

Thursday 9am – Friday 6am Friday 9am-8pm Saturday 9am- 5.45pm

- The Marquee will be open from 9am Thursday and class cards will be available from this time. Any unauthorised alteration to a class card will result in automatic disqualification in that class.
- Severn Marquee will be CLOSED from 6am on the Friday for judging. BY 6am ALL SURPLUS PLANT MATERIAL, PACKING MATERIAL ETC. MUST BE REMOVED
- On Friday the marquee will close at **8.00pm**.
- On Saturday all Exhibitors and members of the general public must leave the marquee by **5.45pm** Re-entry for Exhibitors from 6pm.
- No dismantling or selling of exhibits may take place until exhibitors are re-admitted.
- The Marquee will be closed at 7.30pm. Any exhibits remaining after this time will be disposed of by the Society. All vegetables, fruits, herbs and cut flowers left will be collected by Shrewsbury Food Bank to be distributed through their food hub project.

Vehicles

- A 10 miles per hour speed limit will be enforced on the Showground at all times.
- Exhibitors' vehicles **must** be removed from the Showground before 7.00am Friday. Any remaining vehicles will be towed away at a cost of £100 to the exhibitor.
- Only Vehicles with the appropriate Collection Permit clearly displayed in their vehicle will be admitted, after 6.45pm on Saturday at the Welsh Bridge Gate entrance only for the collection of exhibits. EXIT is via Priory Road Gate.
- Only persons in vehicles with the correct Exhibitor Badge/Collection Ticket will be allowed entry. Vehicle passes are issued at the discretion of the Society. Any instruction issued by security must be complied with at all times.

Staging

- No exhibitor will be allowed to stage more than one exhibit in any class, unless it is within the Begonia section.
- The Society will provide plates for vegetables and fruit classes, and vases for cut flower classes, where appropriate.
- No background, staging or cloth shall exceed 240cms from the ground. Unless otherwise stated: classes will be on tabling.
- Staging provided by the exhibitor must be of a suitable standard and acceptable to the Committee any inappropriate items may be removed by the Committee.
- Any staging provided by the exhibitor must be removed by 7.30pm Saturday.

- All exhibits must have been grown on for at least 3 months by a single exhibitor, unless the schedule makes distinct exception.
- No trade cards or business addresses to be displayed on the exhibit, until after judging.

Judging

- Vegetable Classes will be judged to National Vegetable Society (NVS) rules and regulations.
- Any prize or trophy may, at the discretion of the judges, be withheld or modified if the exhibit be considered undeserving of the prize or trophy offered.
- An exhibitor obtaining a prize fraudulently will forfeit the whole of the prize money or trophy to which he/she may otherwise be entitled which, at the discretion of the Society, may include other classes which he/she has entered, and may be prohibited from exhibiting in future.
- Any protest or objection must be made in writing and handed to the Marquee
 Manager before 11am Friday
- All trophies must be returned to the Secretary of the Society on or before 1st May the following year.

THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES WILL BE FINAL.

The Society will not be responsible for damage done to exhibits, or for the loss of any article.

Dogs

Assistance dogs only are welcomed in all areas.

Please note that no other dogs are allowed on the Showground.

Definitions: The words 'kind' and 'variety' are used in this schedule in the following sense - Sweet Peas, Roses, Carnations are distinct 'kinds' of flowers.

Fragrant Cloud, Peace, Superstar are distinct 'varieties' of Roses.

The Society's utmost priority is the safety of everyone involved in the 2025 Shrewsbury Flower Show and therefore, it reserves the right to reasonably revise or amend the content of this schedule.
